

Minnesotans for Racial Justice group to hold 95th Anniversary Remembrance Event to honor Ernest McDuffey

***Community gathering honors the survivor
of a 1931 attempted lynching in Anoka, Minnesota***

Minnesotans for Racial Justice will host a community gathering at **1:00 p.m. on September 5, 2026, at Riverfront Memorial Park in Anoka, Minnesota**. The event honors the name and legacy of Ernest McDuffey, a Black garage employee who survived an attempted lynching at the Anoka city jail on September 5, 1931. This community gathering marks 95 years since the attempt on his life.

Our goals for the gathering are to have a day of sharing that will make our community stronger by:

- Acknowledging the racial terror and racial violence directed at Ernest McDuffey
- Restoring humanity to Ernest McDuffey (the event is completely erased from public memory)
- Recognizing that Anoka and Minnesota were not isolated from the racial violence that was ever present throughout our country
- Understanding that the social and political foundations of racial injustice and racial violence in the past are the origins of racial inequities and racial violence today
